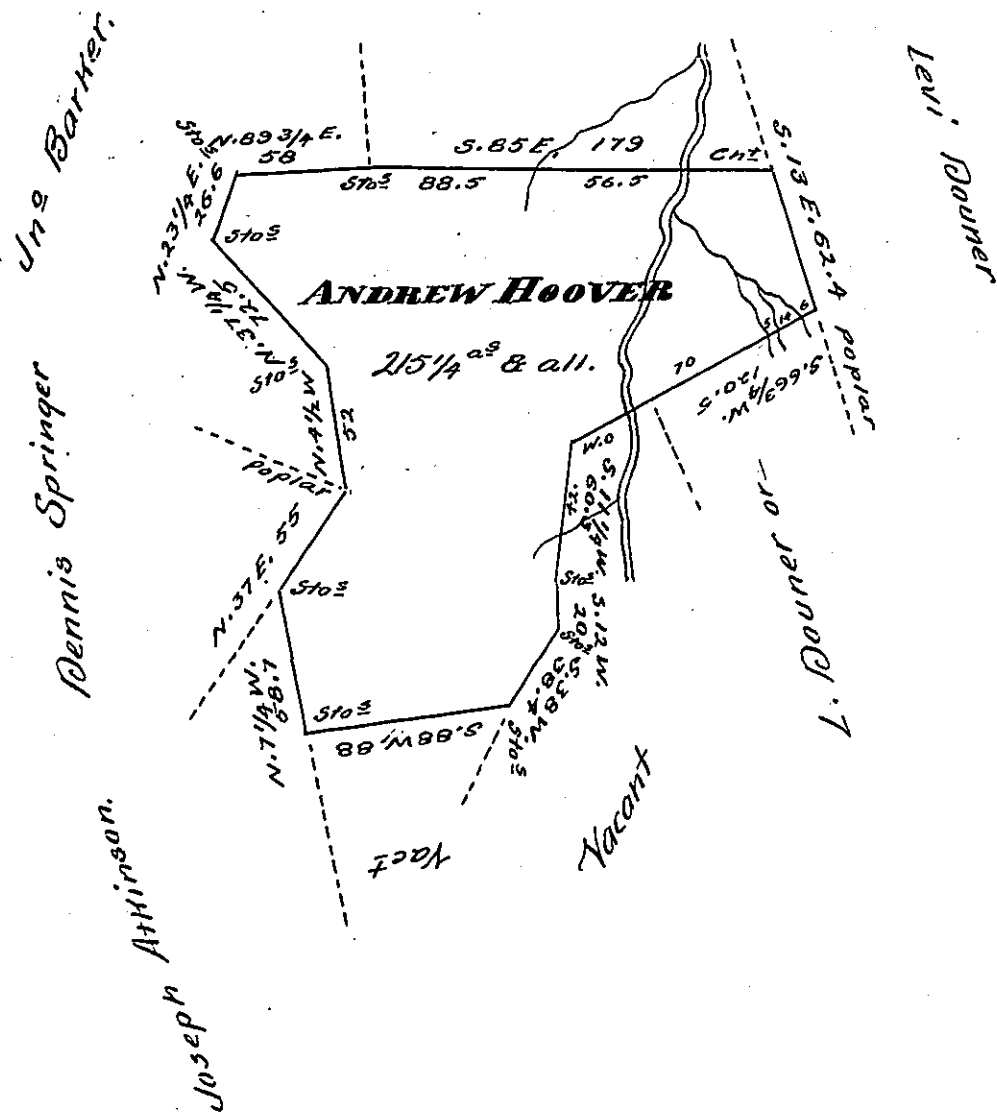


Henry Hoover's old improvement & claim.



SITUATE near the head of Dunbars Run and near the top of Laurel hill, in Wharton, near the line of Union township in Fayette County, Surveyed the 11th & 12th days of April 1833, In pursuance of a Warrant in the name of the s^d Andrew Hoover for 200 acres dated the 24th day of December 1792.

Probably a small part of the western side of this Survey is in Union township, there is 10 or 12 acres cleared, a cabin & orchard appears as it may have been settled 30 or 40 years ago & a family now residing on the tract
